He was a sibling to Margaret Njambi, late Julius Mwaura, Late John Nyanjui, Mary Wanjiku, Agnes Waithera, Peter Wanyoike and James Gitau. He was a step brother to Julius Mwaura, Margaret Wanjiku and the late Partrick Kamande. Raised in a close-knit Christian family amidst eight siblings, Lt Col Martin Mburu displayed early signs of discipline and curiosity, attending to family farm by day while devouring books in the evening, instilling values of hard work and commitment that would shape his journey.

EDUCATION

The late Lt Col Martin Mburu academic path shone brightly from Mugumo-ini Primary School where he excelled in the year 1992. He advanced to Muthithi Secondary School and sat his form four exam in 1996 where he achieved stellar performance. He later joined Maseno University in the year 1998 and graduated in the year 2002. He also graduated with a bachelors degree in Military Science in the year 2015 from Egerton University. Later, he attained a masters degree in Diplomacy and Security Studies from Nazarene University. In the year 2022 he graduated with a Post Graduate Diploma in International Relations from the University of Nairobi

MILITARY CAREER

The late Lt. Col. Martin Mburu's 22 years career in the military begun humbly at Kenya Military Academy in 2003 when he was recruited after graduating from Maseno University. He was commissioned to the rank of Second Lieutenant in 2004 upon completion of Cadet training and posted to Moi Air Base where he continued to work diligently. He held various appointments in the Military such as Technical Officer in Moi Air Base, Defence Intelligence Academy (DIA) as a Senior Instructor, Commanding Officer of Technical Intelligence Battalion among many others and finally before his demise he worked at Directorate of Military Intelligence (DMI)- defence Headquarters.

FAMILY LIFE AND DEVOTION

The late Lt Col Martin Mburu met with the love of his life, Madam Mary Karimi in 2006. Their union was defined by beautiful friendship, respect and sincere love. They shared countless moments of joy, laughter and companionship and were blessed with children namely Jediel Peter Njagi, Emmanuel Murimi, Mark Mwaura and Tamar Njoki-Kamau. As a responsible father, he made time to create quality experiences and memories with his wife and children amidst his busy schedule. He was a husband, brother, son and a friend committed to the wellness of his entire family. Through him, family ties were strengthened and many family members were elicited by his kindness.
